10 Questions to Ask at the Start of a New Year

Once, when the people of God had become careless in their relationship with Him, the Lord rebuked them through the prophet Haggai. "Consider your ways!" (Haggai 1:5) he declared, urging them to reflect on some of the things happening to them, and to evaluate their slipshod spirituality in light of what God had told them.

Even those most faithful to God occasionally need to pause and think about the direction of their lives. It's so easy to bump along from one busy week to another without ever stopping to ponder where we're going and where we should be going. The beginning of a new year is an ideal time to stop, look up, and get our bearings. To that end, here are some questions to ask prayerfully in the presence of God.

1. What's one thing you could do this year to increase your enjoyment of God?
2. What's the most humanly impossible thing you will ask God to do this year?
3. What's the single most important thing you could do to improve the quality of your family life this year?
4. In which spiritual discipline do you most want to make progress this year, and what will you do about it?
5. What is the single biggest time-waster in your life, and what will you do about it this year?
6. What is the most helpful new way you could strengthen your church?
7. For whose salvation will you pray most fervently this year?
8. What's the most important way you will, by God's grace, try to make this year different from last year?
9. What one thing could you do to improve your prayer life this year?
10. What single thing that you plan to do this year will matter most in ten years? In eternity?

Unity Through Humility

“Therefore if there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion, 2 make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose. 3 Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; 4 do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.”

How can we maintain unity in the body of Christ – at LWCC?

1. In order to have unity we have to acknowledge that unity can only be attained through Christ flowing out of His love for us through the indwelling presence or fellowship of the Holy Spirit manifested in our affection and compassion towards one another. (v. 1)

Christ is the source of unity. We are already one in Christ as a Body of believers and we are commanded to preserve or maintain this unity in our church.

Love through our affection and compassion towards one another is the motivation to unity.

The Holy Spirit is the power making unity a reality. Love is the perfect bond of unity.

2. We can maintain unity by being of the same mind. (v. 2)
Same mind – the Greek word means “think the same way”. We can only think the same way if we allow the Holy Spirit to work in us and amongst us.
3. We can maintain unity by maintaining the same love. (v. 2)
Same love – believers are to love others in the body of Christ equally – not because they are equally attractive, but by showing the same kind of sacrificial, loving service to all that was shown to them by Christ.
4. We can maintain unity by being united in spirit. (v. 2)
United in spirit – means “one-souled” and describes people who are knit together in harmony, having the same desires, passions, and ambitions.
5. We can maintain unity by having intent on one purpose. (v. 2)
What should be our one purpose as a church?
Our one purpose as a church is to glorify God in everything that we do.
Our one goal, one desire, one passion is to glorify God as a church.
We are to be consumed by the glory of God.
6. We can only maintain unity if we have the attitude of humility. (v. 3-4)
Selfishness is the number one hindrance to unity. Agree?
We need to have the attitude of humility by regarding others more important than ourselves and by not merely looking for our own personal interest but also for the interest of others.
We may have different opinions but a humble person is considerate of other’s opinion.

It is my fervent prayer that by the grace of God, we will all be united in maintaining unity by pursuing God’s glory in everything that we do as a church which is the Body of Christ. Together, we will be able to accomplish more for His kingdom’s sake and for His glory! Amen.
